

REVISED AGENDA

This revised agenda for the March 14, 2023 Board Meeting was reposted on Friday, March 10, 2023 to add items for Board discussion and/or action in accordance and in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings

Act.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of Plano Independent School District will hold a Board Meeting on Tuesday, March 14, 2023 at 6:00 PM in the Administration Building Board Room located at 2700 West 15th Street in Plano, Texas. The subjects to be discussed are listed on the agenda below. The order in which posted agenda items are taken may be changed by a consensus of the Board Members.

In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code Section 551.127, one or more Board Members may participate via videoconference call. The presiding officer will be physically present at the meeting location. A quorum of the Board intends to be physically present at the meeting location as well.

Meetings of the Board of Trustees may be viewed via live stream at <u>pisd.edu/pisdlive</u>. In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code Section 551.128, a video and audio recording shall be made of all regularly scheduled meetings, work sessions, or special called meetings when the Board votes on any matter or receives public comment. Applicable recordings shall be made available on the District's website not later than seven days after the date the recording was made and maintained on the website for not less than two years. All video recordings are captioned.

Audience participation at a Board Meeting, Work Session, or Special Called Meeting is limited to the portion of the meeting designated to receive public comment in accordance with policy BED(LOCAL). At all other times, the audience shall not enter into discussion or debate on matters being considered by the Board unless requested by the presiding officer.

The Board shall not tolerate disruption of the meeting by members of the audience. If, after at least one warning from the presiding officer, any individual continues to disrupt the meeting by his or her words or actions, the presiding officer may request assistance from law enforcement officials to have the individual removed from the meeting.

4. PUBLIC COMMENT SESSION - AGENDA ITEMS ONLY

Individuals who wish to participate during the portion of the meeting designated for public comment shall submit a public comment card to the presiding officer's designee. Public comment cards will be available one hour before the posted meeting start time and must be received no later than the posted meeting start time. For Board Meetings, the Board will hear public comments regarding agenda and non-agenda items. For Work Sessions or Special Called Meetings, public comments are limited to items on the posted agenda.

In an effort to provide a more efficient process for those who wish to speak during Plano ISD Board meetings, we are pleased to announce that the District is piloting an online speaker signup process. Throughout the pilot period, anyone who wishes to speak at a Board meeting may continue to observe our current public comment process by signing up in person within one hour leading up to the start of the meeting. They may also take advantage of a new online process, which will be available as follows:

- The online signup period for regular Board Meetings and Work Sessions will open from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM the day of the meeting.
- · For all other Board meetings, including but not limited to Special Called Meetings, online signup will be available from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM the business day prior to the scheduled meeting.
- An electronic device will be available in the lobby of the Administration Building during the online signup period for anyone wishing to speak who does not have computer or mobile phone access.

The target date for full implementation of this new online signup process for public comment will be August 2023. During the remainder of this 2022 - 2023 school year, both the online signup form as well as the current in-person paper cards will be available for anyone wishing to speak at Board meetings.

When an individual signs up, the individual must indicate the topic of their comments. Public comment cards, whether submitted in person or online, must

include the speaker's first and last name and are not transferable to another speaker.

When necessary for effective meeting management or to accommodate large numbers of individuals wishing to address the Board, the presiding officer may make adjustments to public comment procedures, including adjusting when public comment will occur during the meeting, reordering agenda items, deferring public comment on non-agenda items, continuing agenda items to a later meeting, providing expanded opportunity for public comment, or establishing an overall time limit for public comment and adjusting the time allotted to each speaker, or make other reasonable adjustments to the timing of public comment in accordance with law. However, no individual shall be given less than one minute to make comments.

Specific factual information or recitation of existing policy may be furnished in response to inquiries, but the Board shall not deliberate or decide regarding any subject that is not included on the posted agenda with notice of the meeting.

The presiding officer or designee shall determine whether an individual addressing the Board has attempted to solve a matter administratively through resolution channels established by policy. If not, the individual shall be referred to the appropriate policy to seek resolution:

For the purpose of considering a negotiated contract for a prospective gift or donation to the District if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the Board's position in negotiations with a third person pursuant to Section 551.073.

For the purpose of considering the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline or dismissal of a public officer or employee or to hear complaints or charges against a public officer or employee pursuant to Section 551.074.

To consider the deployment, or specific occasions for implementation, of security personnel or devices or to deliberate a security audit pursuant to Section 551.076.

To consider the medical records or psychiatric records of an individual applicant for a benefit from the plan; or a matter that includes a consideration of information in the medical or psychiatric records of an individual applicant for a benefit from the plan pursuant to Section 551.0785.

For the purpose of considering discipline of a public school child or children or to hear a complaint by an employee against another employee if the complaint or charge directly results in a need for a hearing pursuant to Section 551.082.

For the purpose of deliberating a matter regarding a public school student if personally identifiable information about the student will necessarily be revealed by the deliberation pursuant to Section 551.0821.

To discuss or deliberate regarding commercial or financial information received from a business prospect, or to deliberate the offer of a financial or other incentive to a business prospect pursuant to Section 551.087.

To discuss or adopt individual assessment instruments or assessment instrument items, or to deliberate a test item pursuant to Section 551.088.

To discuss security assessments or deployments pursuant to Section 551.089 relating to information resources technology; network security information as described by Section 2059.055(b); or the deployment, or specific occasions for implementation, of security personnel, critical infrastructure, or security devices.
